

PROFILE

Dean Schweinler's first awareness of the ocean was during his early years in Hawaii. Growing up in Louisiana, he was heavily influenced by the Age of Cousteau and diving Molasses reef in Key Largo on Christmas Day of 1969, with all of its healthy coral reefs and fishes pointed the direction of where his life would go.

He became a USCG certified, 100 ton, and spent some ten years as a boat captain for Ocean Divers; and ran two 65 ft diving vessels providing him a great deal of time on and in the water developing his underwater photographic skills working with various film and television crews.

He had the opportunity to work with and for the renowned underwater camera inventor, Demitri Rebikoff captaining his boat "Pegasus", the support vessel used demonstrate his underwater video cameras and camera-support sleds to prospective buyers.

His most extreme underwater photographic adventure was beneath twelve feet of ice in Antartica for a PBS documentary. For over two decades he has worked with George Monteiro of Sea-Cam producing everything from television series, feature films, commercials and documentaries, across the globe both under and above the water and has written and produced several award winning underwater films and documentaries.

being done on shallow and deep water corals, reef fishes, polar seas ecosytems, and the changes in seawater itself.

They believe this area is an analog for where to look on Mars for the fossil evidence of where life could have first established itself.
